BY-LAW NUMBER...34.... 19.9.1....

A By-law to provide for numbering of buildings and lots in the City of Thunder Bay.

WHEREAS Section 210, paragraph 106 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 302, authorizes the council of a municipality to pass by-laws for numbering the buildings and lots along any highway, beach, park, reserve or any other property in the municipality that it is considered necessary to number by the council, and for affixing numbers to the buildings and for charging the owner or occupant with the expense incident to the numbering of his lot or property.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF THUNDER BAY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. This By-law may be cited as the "Address Numbering By-law."
2. This By-law shall apply to all property within the City of Thunder Bay including residential and non-residential land.
3. In this By-law,
 - (a) "address number" means the number assigned to a specific property by the Corporation's Building Services Section;
 - (b) "Corporation" means the Corporation of the City of Thunder Bay;
 - (c) "owner" means an owner or occupant of any property in the City of Thunder Bay;
 - (d) "property" includes buildings and lots;
 - (e) "street" means a public highway or public road under the jurisdiction of either the Corporation or the Province of Ontario and which is presently open and maintained by the Corporation or the Province on a year-round basis.
4. The present numbering systems utilized by the Corporation shall continue.
5. An address number may be assigned prior to or upon the issuance of a building permit.
6. An owner shall display an address number in the following manner:
 - (a) The address number shall be affixed to a permanent building situated within 30 metres from a street, and shall be of such a size so as to be clearly legible from both directions of travel on the street and shall be affixed to that side of such building facing such street.
 - (b) The provisions of paragraph (a) will not apply where there is an address number upon or affixed to a sign or other structure located within 30 metres from the street, in such a manner so as to be clearly legible from both directions of travel on the street.



- (c) In the case of a property abutting more than one street, the address number shall be affixed so as to face the street along which the number has been assigned.


7. In the event of an owner neglecting to display an address number in accordance with the provisions of this By-law, it may be affixed by the Corporation, its servants or agents, and the expense incident to the numbering of the lot or property shall be charged to the owner.

8. Any person violating any of the provisions of this By-law shall be subject to a penalty of not more than Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars, exclusive of costs, and all such penalties shall be recoverable under The Provincial Offences Act.


9. By-law Number 227-1976 of The Corporation of The City of Thunder Bay is hereby repealed.

10. This By-law shall come into force and take effect upon its final passing thereof.
