The Forest Capital Development Association, also known as the FCDA, was a completely volunteer based not-for-profit organization. The FCDA was incorporated in July 1998, and in the year 2000, followed the progress of Northwestern Ontario as the selection of Forest Capital of Canada, by a program created in 1979 by the Canadian Forestry Association.

The purpose of the FCDA was to plan and carry out different activities and events which celebrated the title of Forest Capital of Canada. The organization was also responsible for developing and implementing legacy projects which were to have a positive long term effect on the economic and tourism aspects of Northwestern Ontario.

This series includes information on the various contests and competitions which the FCDA was involved with, which include: the Forest Capital of Canada Competition, Envirothon, Poster/Essay Contest, Timbersports, and Forest Capital of Canda-2000 Submissions and Designation. The series includes committee meeting minutes, correspondence, competition rules, marking/scoring sheets, ballots, job descriptions and lists, schedules, competition questions and answers, grant applications, advertisements, competitors, winners and awards, brochures, financial documents, contracts, website printoffs, and general competition information.
