The Forest Capital Development Association, also known as the FCDA, was a completely volunteer based not-for-profit organization. The FCDA was incorporated in July 1998, and in the year 2000, followed the progress of Northwestern Ontario as the selection of Forest Capital of Canada, by a program created in 1979 by the Canadian Forestry Association.

The purpose of the FCDA was to plan and carry out different activities and events which celebrated the title of Forest Capital of Canada. The organization was also responsible for developing and implementing legacy projects which were to have a positive long term effect on the economic and tourism aspects of Northwestern Ontario.

This series relates to all fundraising activities associated with the FCDA and contains an office manual on fundraising, a fundraising binder, sponsorship-directors fundraising information, a fundraising campaign report, Royal Bank fundraising dinner information, FedNor information, and Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation information. These items include correspondence, contacts, spreadsheets, thank you letters and certificates of appreciation, newspaper articles, photographs, reports, proposals, marketing and promotional material, invitations, a menu, and financial documents.
