The Forest Capital Development Association, also known as the FCDA, was a completely volunteer based not-for-profit organization. The FCDA was incorporated in July 1998, and in the year 2000, followed the progress of Northwestern Ontario as the selection of Forest Capital of Canada, by a program created in 1979 by the Canadian Forestry Association.

The purpose of the FCDA was to plan and carry out different activities and events which celebrated the title of Forest Capital of Canada. The organization was also responsible for developing and implementing legacy projects which were to have a positive long term effect on the economic and tourism aspects of Northwestern Ontario.

This series includes information found throughout the rest of the collection. It is made up of cds, floppy disks, and zip disks which contain photos, logos, funding information, proposals, financial information, meetings, various project details, website designs, correspondence, brochures and booklets, databases, indexes, labels, and other various documents.

These records were donated to the archives directly by the Forest Capital Development Association in 2010.
