

George Graham Residence

Description:

This house was built for George Graham, a prominent lumber merchant and later mayor of Fort William. Like most businessmen of this period, Graham was involved in local politics and became mayor in 1913.

Many trees surround this property making the house difficult to see. Red sandstone with ashlar trim was used for construction. There is also a veranda which runs along the north and west walls. The home has a two storey bay window as well as various dormers on the slopes of the hipped roof. There are also tall stone chimneys found on the north and east slopes of the roof.
