Only adopted children and birth parents can apply for Post-Adoption Birth Information. Non-identifying information can also be obtained from the local Children’s Aid Society where the case was handled. Researching adopted ancestors (adoptions prior to 1921): adoptions could only take place through an act of the legislature. Researchers will need to consult Statutes of Ontario in the relevant year. These volumes are accessible at the <u>Archives of Ontario</u> and some major public libraries.
