# Outstanding Community Project Award

For outstanding results in community safety or crime prevention through partnership and collaboration. Up to four projects may be awarded.

#### **SELECTION PROCESS**

Selection for an award will be based on how strongly the nominee embodies the Thunder Bay Crime Prevention Council Guiding Principles.

The Selection Committee will be comprised of members of the Thunder Bay Crime Prevention Council. Members of the Selection Committee will declare any affiliations and/or conflicts of interest in reviewing nominations. The decisions of the Committee will be final.

#### **NOMINATION CRITERIA**

If a nominee has previously received a Mayor's Community Safety Award they are not eligible.

Outstanding Community Projects must be initiated by a Thunder Bay-based individual or organization and benefit Thunder Bay communities. Projects operated by the City of Thunder Bay, its agencies, Boards and Commissions and/or other orders of Government are not eligible. Organizations may submit more than one project; however, only one project per organization will be selected for an award.
