- Many items may be able to be repurposed within your organization
- Items that your organization no longer needs can be sold off

MINIMIZE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

RECYCLE

- Hazardous Waste such as products marked DANGER, POISON, WARNING, or CAUTION pose a threat to the environment and should be disposed of and handled correctly. Drop off such materials at Hazardous Waste drop off locations.
