Description:

The original purpose of the Lyceum Theatre was to provide the community of Port Arthur with a space to accommodate traveling shows. The building was originally constructed in 1909 and has undergone various renovations throughout the years. When it was no longer used for stage productions, it was converted into a motion picture theatre. Currently, the Lyceum Theatre is no longer used as a theatre but has been replaced with several offices and stores. There are many significant architectural features of the building. Some of which include keystones with bearded faces, segmented semi-circular windows, and a large stone panel in the center of the façade with the name LYCEUM prominently incised in large letters. The building is steel framed with brick facing and stone trim.
