Building orientation on Property:

- Building sits in the middle of a large lot that borders McVicar Creek, Courts St. N. and Ray Court

Current Building Use:

Bed and Breakfast

Exterior Building Design /**Materials:**

- The pitch faced exterior walls are red sandstone and the brickwork has been designed in a random ashlar pattern

- The north wall has a “v” shaped tower projecting from the main building

- Main entranceway is projected out from the main building and is two and a half storeys high

- At the south end of the east wall there is a three storey polygonal semi-detached tower

- The house has a decorated cornice that skirts the eaves with intricately designed

brackets

- The back portion of the verandah has been closed by windows

- Arched brickwork around some of the windows

Roof Design/Materials:

- Cross gabled roof design
- Gabled dormers
- Eaves of a unique design

- Shed roof type over verandah area

- Asphalt shingles

Window Design:

- A variety of window designs - arched, casement and fixed

- Unique moldings around windows

- Half of the verandah area has been enclosed with modern glass windows

Additional Details:

- Queen Anne house design
- Ionic columns surround the verandah area
- Brick chimney on the back of the house that has a corbelled top
- Original closing in of verandah was done in 1928
